THE LAST DAYS OF SUMMER

What an incredible season this has been. I swear there IS a heaven—right here, amidst Oak and Sycamore trees, wild birds, a beautiful creek, trails, lots of smiling children exploring the Museum's "Nature's Playground", and it's all located right around our aviary. How I'd love to see this scenario play itself out all over the world.

Please do stop by between 2 and 4 PM when we bring our birds outdoors. We'd love to meet you or see you again.

This summer was our busiest summer ever:

- We presented 21 summer programs for camps, Boys & Girls Clubs, SB Museum of Natural History (SBMNH), SB Botanic Garden, UCSB and others. This included student & family field trips to the Carpinteria Salt Marsh, the SBMNH, Lake Los Carneros, and a family boat cruise at Lake Cachuma. Some of the programs were funded by previous grants, and we also generated \$3,000 in program fees.
- We now have educational interactions with Museum visitors featuring our live birds between 2 and 4 pm every day of the week. We plan to expand the hours as resources allow.
- Our number of volunteers has grown to 29 bird presenters and 4 administrative assistants, nearly doubling our pre-move-in numbers. This is great news, as 80% of Eyes in the Sky operates through its volunteers.
- We recently received two foundation grants: \$15,000 from the **Wallis Foundation** and \$5,000 from the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians Foundation. We are grateful for their ongoing support.
- We also wish to thank
 - YOU, for sponsoring the guard rail that now keeps busy faces and hands away from the aviary windows.
 - Citrix Online for donating 3-years of GoToMyPC software (valued at \$750) which networks the computers at SBAS's Aviary/Volunteer Headquarters on the grounds of the SB Museum of Natural History and the computer in the home office of the Eyes-in-the-Sky Program Director.
 - Afar Communications Inc. for donating internet communications equipment (valued at \$3,500) which connects SBAS' Aviary/Volunteer Headquarters with SB Museum of Natural History's internet.

STICKS AND THRONES

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About three months ago, a white-haired visitor with a beautiful hand-made walking stick began stopping by our aviary nearly every single day. He would stay for an hour or two, studying our birds and our interactions with them each afternoon.

Noticing the tall stick our Kestrel Kachina loves to perch on, he offered to make her a very special "walking stick".

Just a few days later it was finished, and Kachina instantly recognized it as her property.

Made from a common Pittosporum branch, patterns carved into the leather-like bark expose the wood underneath in lovely patterns, and gold tacks encircle the top, instantly giving Kachina the nickname "The Queen", as she now sits on her throne and rules us from there.

Last week Peregrine falcon Kisa also received a new "throne" (picture below), so now we have two falcon queens.

And on Saturday, Sept. 3rd, **Richard Nordli** became our 29th bird care volunteer, and began working with Kachina. Welcome, Richard. We were all hoping you would join us.


